Environment



- Be alert for moving vehicles and machines in your vicinity.

Working high up



- Work from a cherry picker.

Electrical pruning cutters



- Wear safety gloves

Working on greenhouse roofs



- Use fall protection such as a safety harness and a chalk cart.

Cold and damp



- Wear proper, warm clothing, For example a thermal jacket (body-warmer).
- Wear rain clothing on top if it rains.
- Wear good work boots.

Sprayed crops




- Wait until the re-entry period expires. At least 24 hours.
- Wash your hands before eating, drinking or smoking.
- Cover your skin with cotton clothing as much as possible.
- Wash your clothes at night.

Pushing carts



- Do not overload the cart.
- Keep the floor clean.
- Use tools such as an electric pumping cart.
- Wear non-slip work boots.

Machine is running



- Keep your distance from moving parts.

Peeling bulbs



- Sit properly before the conveyor belt so you can easily reach the bulbs.
- Set the chair to the right height.
