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Cooling cells

- ✓ Wear special protective clothing:
- ✓ Winter coverall, winter jacket (parka), hat, scarf, gloves and thick warm safety shoes or boots.

Driving a forklift truck

- ✓ Only on the forklift truck with a certificate or after a thorough training and supervision.
- ✓ Low speed, low load.

Being squeezed

- ✓ Be alert when operating the tailboard.
- ✓ Look at what the tailboard is doing.
- ✓ Keep your fingers and hands away from where they could be caught or squeezed.

Hazardous environment

- ✓ Always observe the traffic rules. Walk on the walking paths.
- ✓ Be alert on your environment. Look and listen.
- ✓ Wear safety shoes or boots.
- ✓ Wear a safety vest outside.

Hitching a ride

- ✓ Just walk, don't hitch a ride.
- ✓ Use special tools for working high up.

Spraining

- ✓ Step or climb, don't jump
- ✓ Wear safety shoes or boots

Manual Handling

- ✓ Use tools such as a trolley.
- ✓ Prevent lifting loads that are too heavy.

Falling

- ✓ Leave enough standing room on the tailboard for standing properly.

Opening a sea container

- ✓ Ask the supervisor if the container is safe to open.
- ✓ Do not open until the released-for-access certificate.

Stacking

- ✓ Stacks must be vertical (perpendicular).
- ✓ Stacking height should be appropriate for the product's load-bearing capacity.
- ✓ The maximum number of items to be stacked must be clear.
- ✓ Goods may not be damaged (broken pallet, torn sacks).
